The Oldest and the Youngest

You can't say the Luton, Dunstable & District Netball League is not inclusive as players young and old compete across its divisions in South Bedfordshire. One their players, Julia Sandifer, has been involved for a remarkable 47 years and the Leighton Buzzard Comets' Wing Attack is the league's longest-serving player, having first competed in it aged 14. Leighton Buzzard Comets, who play in Division One, can also boast the league's oldest player in the ever youthful 71-year-old Barbara Walsham. Michelle Rooney, chair of



the league said "It is heart-warming to watch Comets playing each weekend, as well as being great

netballers and role models for all teams, they are great friends and regularly show that experience can outwit youth".

Meanwhile, in Division Two, there is a player who is 57 years Walsham's junior, 14-year-old Charley Plummer. Charley plays Wing Attack for Black Tornadoes and is the leagues youngest player. Coach focus

23 year old netball coach Kellie Hair is from Houghton Regis in Bedfordshire.

Although Kellie did play netball at school, her first sporting passion was football, playing for Luton girls team and at county level while she was at school. However a bad ankle injury meant that she had to give up football and so she found herself joining Luton Panthers.

Since then she's never looked back and became involved



with Luton Community Netball as captain and helping coach and plan training sessions. At 21, Kellie took her Level 2 coaching qualification.

After completing a degree in international management Kellie decided that business wasn't for her and that she'd like to become a specialist PE teacher and will start a PGCE in Primary PE Education next year at Bedford University.

In preparation for her course, Kellie has taught at local primary and secondary schools and also coaches our Team Beds and Luton ladies Get Back Into Netball sessions at Van Dyke Upper School and Robert Bloomfield Middle School.







Coaching children is Kellie's passion. She has a young niece and three nephews and loves to practice and develop her coaching sessions using their feedback. Kellie also has experience of one-to-one coaching of children with special needs, with the aim of getting them back into mainstream PE

Kellie says: "I love the way that young kids have a real appreciation of your skills as a coach and are creative in the way that they do drills and play games. There's no limits with them and it's very rewarding for the coach."

Kellie currently plays for Luton Panthers as centre, wing attack or wing defence. "As a player, I understand the game, and also the frustrations and emotions involved in the game and use this experience to improve my coaching sessions." Kellie has ambitions to take her Level 3 coaching certificate when she has more experience under her belt.

Cranfield Netball Club

Cranfield Netball Club is based in Cranfield, Bedfordshire. The small village club was launched in 1999 with 9 players can now boast 13 teams in total, although we are a village club we are actually not that small, with 7 adult teams, 2 youth teams and 4 junior teams totalling approximately 130 players!

Alison Brightman was chair of the club until she recently retired and along with Cathie Carter and Paula Beddoe who formed the club 16 years ago. Alison is very proud of what the club has achieved this year and actually every year since it's launch, the teams have produced some remarkable results. Some of the Achievements since the onset are:- 2008 Cranfield Nomads finished in 6th Place in the U19 National Clubs Competition; Cranfield Nomads, Swallows and Raiders all were Bedfordshire U14 and U16 County Champions reaching the Regional Clubs Rounds and last year Cranfield Ravens reached the U14 RCL round.

She travelled to Australia with the squad in September and they won the U18 World title, beating the Aussies on their home turf so she has a gold medal, but not only that, she was voted U18 player of the whole Tournament and player of the Final, this is such an amazing achievement for Beth.









- * Natalie Carter Nationally was the youngest B award umpire when she was only 18. She went on to play for Loughborough Lightning and the English Universities Squad, she is an active level 2 coach now playing, umpiring and coaching in Singapore.

Sam has previously played for Mavericks and Loughborough Lightening Youth along with the English Universities Squad.
- * Danielle Lay and Georgia Richardson also played for Loughborough NPL and Danielle is currently involved with Team Northumbria.
- * Alison Brightman has since past her 25 years of service to England Netball through volunteering, coaching, umpiring and development.
- * Cranfield NC have a vast range of expertise in all areas of officiating and Fran Wade secretary of the Club is currently Bedfordshire's Official of the Year.
- * Cranfield NC also have a Regional adult Team who play in the 2nd Division of the East Region League, and are currently this season sitting 2nd in the table.

Cranfield work extremely hard to encourage youngsters and adults to volunteer within the club and encourage them to take Umpiring and coaching awards and have mentoring opportunities for buddies, coaches and umpires at all levels. The club have supported all of the above and many more through the whole process and will continue to do the same with other youngsters and volunteers as they come through the Club. A quote from Alison – "What's that saying "you reap what you sow" and I believe sowing the educational seed in our youngsters is very important, in fact as a Club I think it's probably one of the most important aspects of what we do. It is great that we encourage the girls to play and keep physically active, and we hope that physical activity (netball hopefully) will become a lifelong habit that they keep, but the up skilling of the youngsters is a real string in their bows as they venture out into the world."

The new chair is now Johnny Cochrane. Alison is now honorary President of the club.
